#### The Archerfish of Pulau Pef

Raja Ampat is deemed a «species factory for marine life», and scientists describe the region as one of the most biodiverse seascapes in the world. The lush reefs are home to 75% of all known coral species and over 1,500 different reef fish.


Pulau Pef is a kind of «mini Raja Ampat» and offers not only lush coral reefs but also dense mangrove forests that provide a habitat for numerous marine species. In addition to many other fish species, the mangrove lagoons of our island are also home to numerous Archerfish.

These fascinating animals are particularly notable for their extraordinary hunting behaviour. They are known to prey on land-dwelling insects and other small animals by shooting them with water drops from their specialised mouths or even jumping out of the water altogether.

They are remarkably accurate in their shots and can bring down their prey up to 3 m above the water surface.

When aiming, they compensate for the refraction of light at the air-water interface and normally spit at the prey at an average angle of about 74° to the horizontal, but can still aim accurately at angles between 45° and 110°.

Recently, with the help of a lure, our long-time facility manager Marcel was able to capture the hunting behaviour of Pulau Pef's archerfish on camera. Check out the great footage in the video below!
