As a result of the meeting, shortly afterwards, the first shipment of goods arrives at Pulau Pef (Pef island), using the PEF 1



The cement mixer is heavy!... but is offloaded with seemingly no effort!



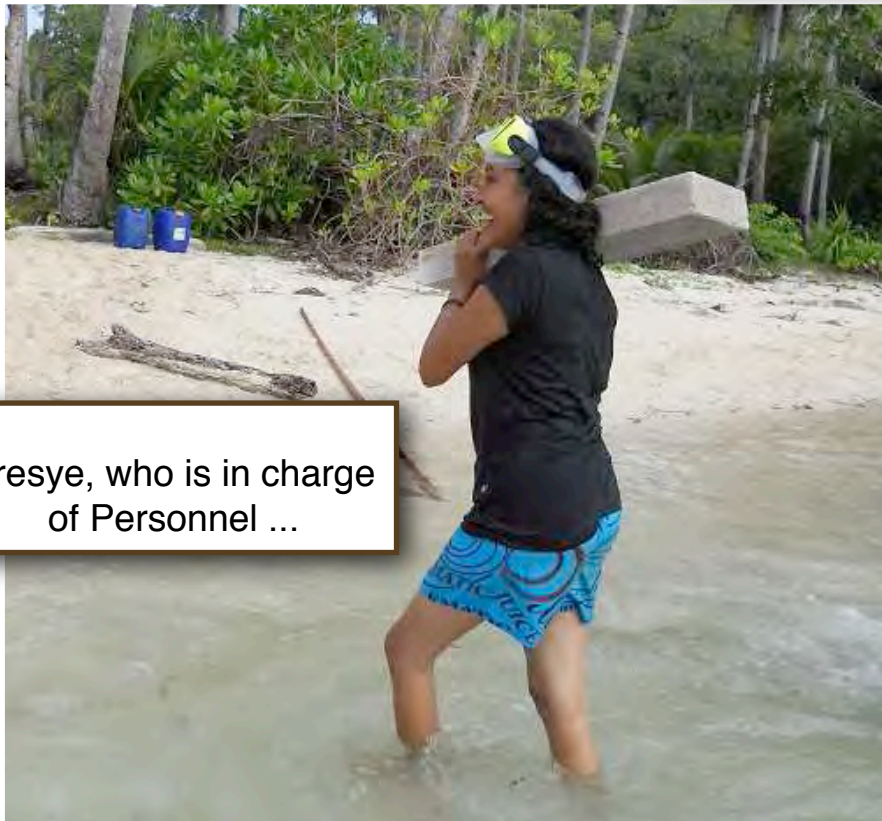


Maya...

The priority was to get the bathroom and toilets for the workers ready, and work started immediately...



Pef 1 returned to Sorong, to pick up more supplies and more importantly, the workers, who had arrived from Java - most of them we already knew from before, and so it was joyful reunion!



Back on Pulau Pef, we were happy to take the first delivery of wood for construction, from the surrounding villages - Kayu Besi (Iron wood for planks - in the foreground), as well as Kayu Gatal (mangrove wood for poles - on the far left),
-well, well - the advance planning worked after all!



Payment to the villagers for the wood, is made in the makeshift Kantor (office), which also serves as a sleeping quarters for people, and occasionally crabs too!



The makeshift Dapur (kitchen) and scullery...



...and of course, the Swiss influence (Maya)
-proper RECYCLING, even on a construction site on
a jungle island in the middle of nowhere!!





...testing the homemade wood-work machinery - it all works very well indeed!



Danci from neighbouring Kabui village, has the task of gathering leaves and old coconut husks for burning, and separates useful coconut wood...



...while others measure, sharpen blades and bend iron.....



A small 5kVA generator powers the drills, grinders, the office computer and shed some light in the evenings...



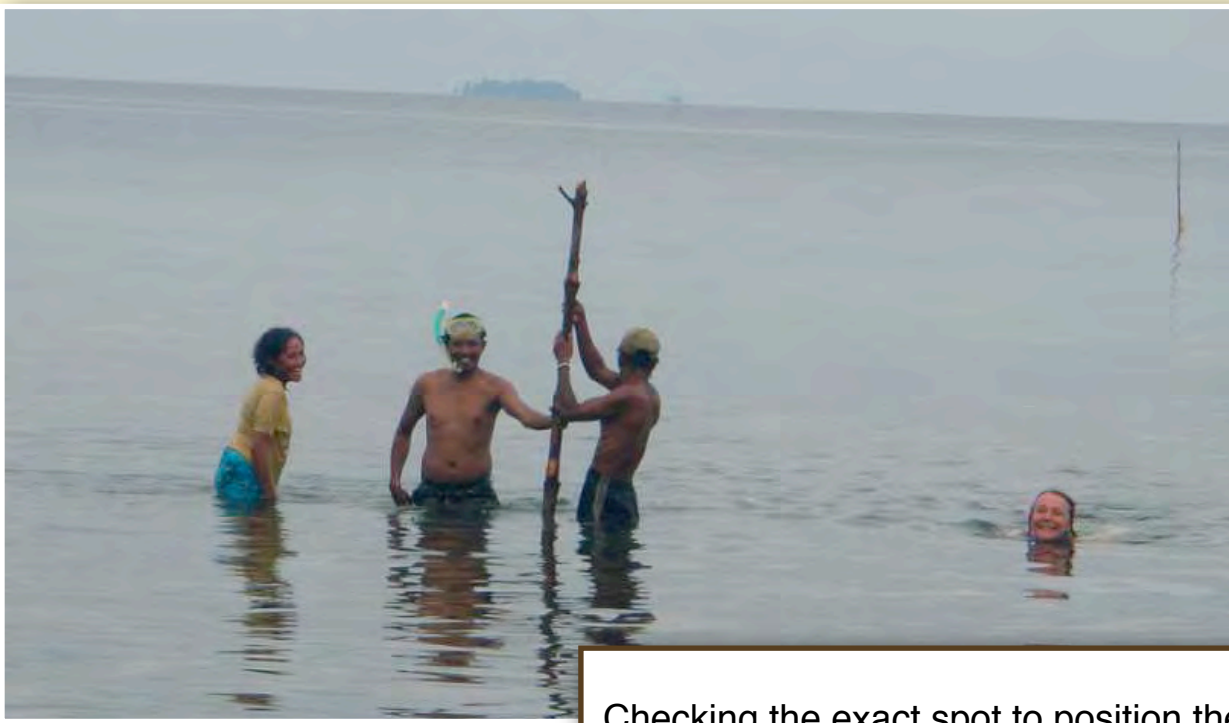
Sleeping quarters for the workers and laundry

In addition, another water source, or Mata Air (literally translated as 'eye of water') is found in the forest - this is worth GOLD, as a back-up water source!

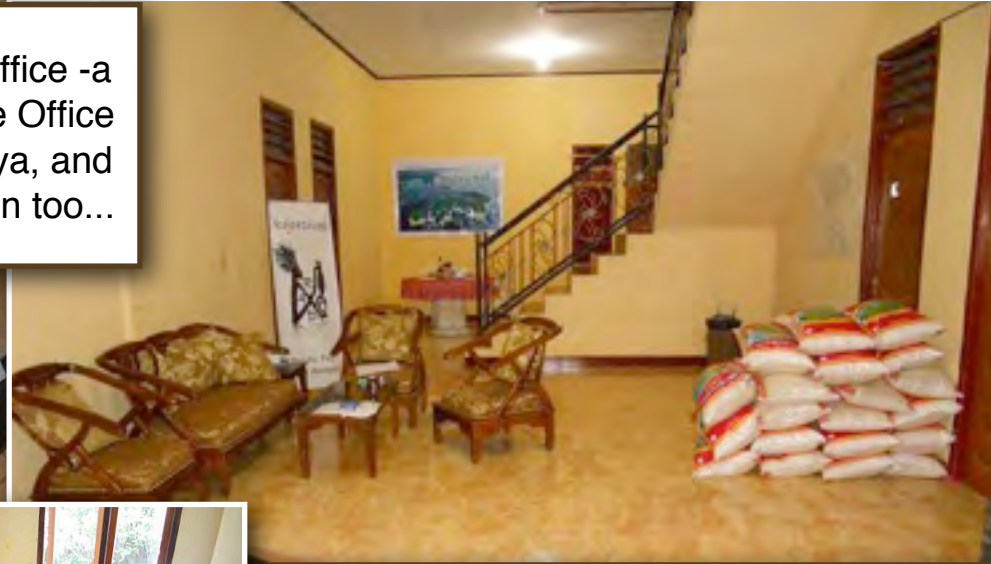


The facade, currently under renovation...

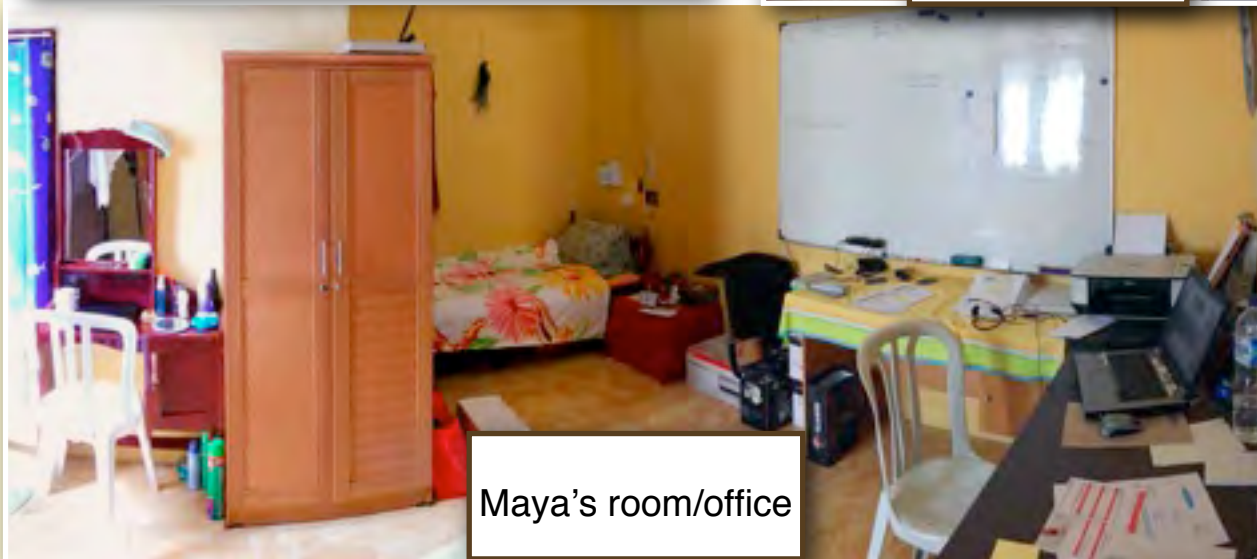
Back in Sorong, we have an office -a large house now serves as the Office for Logistics, Finance and Maya, and when required, accommodation too...
